Re Air Combat Capability Plan

1. At a meeting on 22nd September last, with the Defence Minister Dr Brendan Nelson's Aeronautical Advisor, Mr Denis Hughes, he informed me that the United States Government would not sell Australia the Lockheed -Martin F-22.

This is to ask if you could personally ask the U.S. President if they would lift any such ban. (I'm suggesting cashing in a few goodwill chips) If you then advise despite your personal request, that they refuse to supply the F-22 to their closest ally, then so be it; we will have to consider a second best solution to our most important and costly defence acquisition.

2. This is to strongly urge you and your Committee colleagues to postpone until well into next year, and certainly not prior to the JSCFADT Report, the signing of the imminent Memorandum Of Understanding in respect to the Joint Strike Fighter as a consequence of its delayed development schedule and massive cost escalation and until better and more economical solutions are fully explored. (and of course depending on the outcome of para.1 above)

Please do not refer this letter to the Defence Dept. for them to reply, as these two requests are for your personal action as Chairman of the National Security Committee, and I do not want them subject to Defences usual obfuscation and excessive delays.
